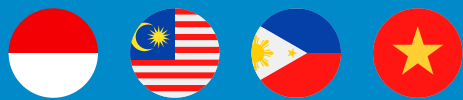

Our local impact



Southeast Asia

20 Tech Hubs in underserved communities across Southeast Asia by the **end of 2020**. The program provides technology and entrepreneurship training for students aged 13 and above.



India

Since 2017, **HP's World on Wheels (Wow)** mobile buses, which are Internet-enabled, solar-powered mobile classrooms, have been traveling across India to provide learners with access to technology for learning.



Indonesia

To reduce ocean plastic pollution, we joined **Project STOP**, setting up a Material Recovery Centre in Indonesia to collect, manage and recycle plastic waste, impacting 60,000 people and have generated over 100 full-time jobs.



China

HP has used more than **164,000** straw pallets for shipping its inkjet printers, diverting over 7,400 tons of straw from being burnt as agricultural waste.

HP is collaborating with the **World Wildlife Fund (WWF)** to restore, improve and protect tens of thousands of forest acres by end-2024.



New Zealand

To reduce e-waste, HP introduced the **Tidy Tech Kiwi** program to collect and recycle used IT equipment, diverting over **8,000 kg** of e-waste from landfills and raising money for seven schools.
